Previous activities compiled by the NYS Coalition on Elder Abuse and Lifespan Possibilities for June 15, during that week, or throughout the month of June



In your organization:

- Wearing purple on June 15th.
- Special WEAAD t-shirts worn by staff.
- Inside and/or outside decorations to raise public awareness signs, flags, posters, pinwheel garden.
- Press event with elected officials, community members, faith organizations, businesses leaders, etc.

In your community:

- Local community forums with multiple speakers.
- Educational information in local newsletter.
- Tables with information set up inside or outside local organizations or government buildings.
- Tabling events in various locations, including at libraries, fairs, picnics, senior events, farmer's market, etc.
- Conference, training and/or presentations planned around WEAAD in June.
- Run local radio ads a week before.
- Local TV news segments and public service announcements.
- Local news interviews with DSS/APS, OFA, and Victim Services.
- Formal or informal presentations at OFA meal sites; educational placemats for the tables.
- Panel discussion on elder abuse in an underserved population in the community.
- Hold an awareness walk in your neighborhood.
- Fun event idea from Australia afternoon tea parties. Attendees encouraged to wear purple.
- Collect and distribute Caring Cards to homebound elders receiving meal services.
- Free document shredding events.
- Lighting buildings, bridges, and water in purple.
 - o Think about the increasing number of colorful lights you have seen at different times.
 - Find out how special lighting is requested by contacting local government offices, educational institutions, business, building management companies, etc.
 - Post pictures of purple lights and include in press releases.
- Plan a social media campaign.
- Post organization and community activities on social media before and after events.
- Press conferences with prominent local celebrities and elected officials.
- Local government proclamation.
- Article in local paper health related section.

Partnership Possibilities:

- Think about ways to collaborate with other organizations on various recognition activities: libraries, nutrition sites, local emergency services, law enforcement, OFA, DSS/APS, Victim Services.
- Combine purple lighting with an event and/or press coverage.
 - o Collaborate with local elected officials, businesses, educational institutions, agencies, etc.
 - o Publicize in different ways before, during, and after.
- Work with neighborhood associations to encourage individual homeowners and businesses to use purple lights. Then publicize the event.
